

The Spa at Cliff House Maine

Guests descend a spiral staircase to reach the seaside spa, where two-story pendant lights taper over the center and reflect in the flowing pool of water below, creating a contemporary grotto. The Douglas fir ceiling, teak chaise lounges, and treatment rooms with woven linen wallcoverings and bluestone flooring complement the Atlantic Ocean views that fill the space.

Times Ocean Club House

Guangzhou, China

Encompassing a gym, dance studio, swimming pool, and rooms for billiards and table tennis, the club unites geometric lines with marble mosaic grain in the lobby, where its irregular staircase doubles as a sculpture. On the basketball court, the walls and ceiling are merged, their curved relationship amplified by LED lighting, while an undulating ceiling in the pool area mimics waves.
